Grantham College Media student Chae Price has won a 'five-star review' and a job offer from local company Property Video Solutions after competing in a challenge to create a short film to showcase Grantham.

So impressed was the company with Chae's film of Grantham, it offered him a short period of work experience, whereupon the student wowed the business again, resulting in a job offer this autumn.



Chae, 17, who is currently studying for a Level 3 Diploma in Creative Digital Media Production at the college, chose a selection of Grantham's attractions to feature in his film. He said: "I really enjoyed researching and creating the film, partly because I got to discover and try out lots of the activities available in the town, such as bowling and trampolining, while I was making it! I never imagined it would lead to a job offer."



Chris England, Managing Director of Property Video Solutions, who set the challenge for the all the students in the Level 3 Media Studies group, said: "The challenge was an opportunity for each of the students to create a valuable piece of work that is vocationally relevant and which would support their learning. It was also a chance for them to exhibit their talents and create a film to add to their personal portfolios.

"After reviewing the students' films, Chae's stood out as excellent in many aspects. It showed his varied technical skills, including use of animation, aerial footage and overlays. His film was engaging and well story-boarded with a clear narrative and a strong start, middle and end. It was edited to a very high standard and was the perfect length too."

Chae has now taken up a part-time role with the company, working there alongside his college studies. To date, he has assisted with more than 30 film projects, creating content and helping with film shoots for a range of commercial clients, including national companies.

Chris added, "During his work experience with us, Chae quickly displayed all the attributes we look for in an employee: commitment, drive and wanting to do well. He continually looked to support other staff and was willing to help with any job that needed doing. Also, unusually for a young person these days, he was never distracted by his mobile phone! We could instantly see that he would be a great addition to our team."

Chae says he is very grateful for the opportunities he's been given by Property Video Solutions, with the chance to develop his skills and knowledge, and, to talk to the staff about the projects they have been involved with. He said, "It has been a real insight into what it's like to work in the real world and has helped me to create a clearer vision of my future career in the industry."

Grantham College Institute of Technology (IoT)

We're excited to announce that the Grantham College's Institute of Technology (IoT) facility is now open. The doors opened to learners and tutors on 01 November 2021, filled with great learning spaces and specialist equipment. Our IoT site sees the historic Grade II-listed Stonebridge House converted into a state-of-the-art Engineering, Science, and Digital Skills hub. The IoT project has restored Stonebridge House to its former glory by turning it into a cutting-edge teaching and learning facility. The building is equipped with IT design studios, digital technology suites, and Engineering robotics facilities

IoTs are collaborations between colleges, universities and employers. They focus on the specific technical skills required to bridge the skills gaps in our local area. IoTs provide employers with a skilled workforce and students with a clear route to technical employment. Grantham College is a member of the consortium of further and higher education providers, led by the University of Lincoln that will bring substantial capital funding to our region with the Lincolnshire Institute of Technology (#LIoT).

IoTs specialise in delivering higher technical university-level education (at Levels 4 and 5) with a focus on STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) subjects. At Grantham College, the Institute of Technology focuses on Engineering and Digital routes. Grantham College has a strong background in Engineering and welcomes the opportunity via the IoT to fill skills gaps in local industries. As the IoT will provide the latest innovative technologies to work with, the College is putting on many new Digital courses.

IoT courses at Grantham College include HNC/D Computing and Systems Development, Cloud Computing, Digital Technologies, Engineering (Manufacturing, Electrical, and Mechanical) courses and new apprenticeships in Automation and Controls, and Software Development.



IoT courses are employer led and informed. The Lincolnshire IoT involves working partnerships with employers including Siemens Industrial Turbomachinery Ltd, Olympus Automation Limited, and Bakkavor Plc. The employers will contribute in a real way to the delivery of the courses, providing opportunity for students to visit and attend businesses, and ensuring that IoT graduates can deliver what businesses want when they graduate. The Grantham College IoT is creating the training that local businesses need, and that give students the best opportunity of employment when they graduate, in good jobs.

In changing the way higher-level education is delivered, and featuring innovative new courses and cutting-edge facilities, Grantham College's Institute of Technology is genuinely transformational. 

T-LEVELS. Welcome to the next level!


From 2022, we are offering T Levels in a variety of subject areas:

- Business Management & Administration
- Digital
- Education & Childcare
- Engineering and Manufacturing
- Health & Science
- Site Construction Carpentry and Joinery
- Site Construction Brickwork Pathway
- More T Levels will be introduced over the next few years, as they are developed jointly by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education and employers.

What are T Levels?

T Levels are an exciting new vocational study option available after you have completed your GCSEs. T Levels are two year programmes, equivalent to 3 A Levels, which are a unique hybrid of high quality technical training in the classroom and an extended industry placement. 80% of your time will be spent in the classroom with a further 20% out on placement with an employer gaining invaluable, up to date industry skills.

T Levels are designed to give you the knowledge and experience you need to get a head start on your chosen career. When you complete your T Level qualification, you will be able to go straight into employment, an apprenticeship or higher education. Grantham College was among the first colleges in the country to be chosen by the government to deliver T Level qualifications as a high quality vocational alternative to A Levels.



Paul Deane, Principal and Chief Executive of Grantham College, said: "T-Levels have been created by the Department for Education to ensure companies can recruit 'work ready' candidates who have the skills and attributes sought by industry.

"We, as a college, are focussed on furnishing students with the skills industry needs and so are embracing the opportunities T-Levels bring. Industry placements are the first step and have already brought real benefits to students and businesses alike."



Transition Programme

For those who are not quite ready to embark on a full T Level, we are also offering the option of a one year T Level Foundation Programme at Level 2 to support our students with a smooth transition to T Levels. The Foundation programme is a dedicated pathway to help prepare you for the theory, concepts and skills that will be developed on the full T Level programme.
