

Grantham College has been working in partnership with Skills Builder since 2020 to help our students develop essential life skills, unlock learning in the classroom, boost academic outcomes, perseverance and self belief.

Having these skills halves the likelihood of being out of work and increases earnings across a lifetime, also increasing wellbeing and life satisfaction.

Listening, Speaking, Problem Solving, Creativity, Staying Positive, Aiming High, Leadership and Teamwork are mapped across all our curriculum areas to support students' understanding on how they link with the skills and knowledge they learn in their subjects.

Work Experience

All students aged 16-19, and students aged 19-24 who have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP), are expected to undertake 30 hours work experience that complements their study plan.

This is in recognition that young people should be gaining real experience and knowledge of the workplace in order to enhance their employability, to practice their skills and to develop their career choices.

Students should attempt to source their own placement as this helps them to practice the skills of finding employment in the future. Parents are encouraged to support their son/daughter in doing this.
